INFRASTRUCTURE

College has 14 departments as per NCISM norms namely : Rachna Sharir, Kriya Sharir, Maulik Sidhanta, Dravyaguna, Agad Tantra, Ras Shastra, Swasthvritta, Roga Nidana, Shalya Tantra, Shalakya Tantra, Prasuti Tantra & Stri Rog, Kaumarabhritya, Kaya Chikitsa, Panchakarma. We have intelligent, devoted, well educated teaching faculty.

Maulik Siddhant

This department is the first and most important Department of Ayurveda. The Department is concerned with basic principles of Ayurveda which are described in classical texts. It has unique library loaded with Samhitas, all Vedas and Sanskrit books. Students are not only taught Sanskrit but all the abovesaid basic texts of Ayurveda.

Rachna Sharir

The museum of the department is having models, charts, specimens, skeleton and dummies. The specimens prepared from the cadavers is the beauty of our museum. Cadaver tub and cadavers are made available in our well equipped dissection hall .

Sharir Kriya

The Department deals with normal functioning of human body and its parts. The section of Kriya Sharir is involved in study of scientific basis of saptadhatus, tridoshas and deha-manasprakriti. The scientific evaluation of Tridosha has great importance from stand point of Diagnosis and Therapy. This Department is also carrying out work on Psychosomatic basis of health and Diseases.

Apparatus and equipments required to teach human physiology to the students are available in its laboratory. Models, Specimens and Departmental Library are there for teaching aids. Practical Physiological demonstrations are given to the students.

DravyaGuna Vigyan

The department is well furnished with museum having rich collection of various drugs of plants origin, animal origin and minerals too. Pharmacological studies, macroscopic and microscopic studies of various medicinal plants is the important feature of this department. Unique herbal garden is well maintained to educate the students. An educational trip is organized every year to acquaint the students with herbs of different areas also.

Ras Shastra

Our Ras Shastra department is equipped with Pharmacy (Manufacturing Unit), Analytical Laboratory, a store house for raw herbs and prepared products. Here the students are taught to prepare pure Ayurvedic medicines. Pure herbal, herbomineral and mineral (bhasmas) products-Churna, Vati, Sharbat, Avaleh (Chyavanprash), Taila etc. are prepared to educate the students and also made available to hospital and general public at economical rates.

Agad Tantra

The department has well equipped museum having charts, models, specimens and educational CDs related to Poisons and Forensic Medicine. It has departmental library to inculcate the ancient and latest knowledge in students.

Swasthvritta

Department is well equipped with all models and charts related to swasthavritta and yog. It has adopted five villages under swach bharat abhiyaan to guide the students about the importance of hygiene in maintaining

the health. Health check up camps are organised in the surrounding areas by this department.

Rog Nidan

Two laboratories are maintained, one is for the students and second is linked with hospital for clinical investigations. Haematology, Biochemistry, Microbiology, X-Ray Wing and Ultrasonography sections of this department are giving economical services to the society. Duly qualified pathologist and laboratory technician look after it.

Prasuti Tantra

The department has well furnished infrastructure with models and manikins for normal deliveries and gynaecological examination. Departmental library with all ayurvedic and modern books of gynae are also available. A well equipped Operation Theatre and Labor room and trained staff is attached with this department.

Kaumar Bhritya

This department deals with the study of normal growth and diseases related to children. Department has charts and models of various diseases related to children. Vaccination facility is also available.

Kaya Chikitsa

The department has well furnished infrastructure with models and charts on various diseases. Well maintained Departmental library is there.

Shalya Tantra

Shalya Tantra is the main branch of Ashtang Ayurveda which deals with the study of disorders requiring surgical interventions. The department is well equipped with latest clinical models, charts and departmental library with latest and Ancient Ayurvedic texts for students. The department is also having both OT and minor OT and high-tech computer system with printer.

Shalaky Tantra

This department deals with the diseases of Head, Neck, ENT and Eye. The charts and models required are available. Department has well equipped library and computer system.

Panch Karma

This department has well maintained departmental library and various charts and models. All the five karmas are being performed on the patients.

LIBRARY

- *College Library is enriched with more than ten thousand books on Ayurvedic sciences and modern medicine.
- *Magazines and generals are also available to update the students and the teaching staff.
- *Seating capacity of seventy students and separate seating arrangement for teachers is there.

DEGREE TO BE AWARDED

Ayurved Acharya (Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery- B.A.M.S)

The Candidate shall be awarded Ayurved Acharya (Bachelor of Ayurvedic Medicine and Surgery-B.A.M.S) degree after passing the final examination, and thereafter satisfactorily completing the compulsory rotatory internship extending over twelve months.

MEDIUM OF INSTRUCTION

Sanskrit, Hindi, any recognized regional language or English.

Minimum of three elective subjects are required to be chosen by the student in every professional year.

FIRST PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION

The first professional examination shall be held in the following subjects:-

- Electives Subjects (Minimum Three)

SECOND PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION

The second professional examination shall be held in the following subjects:-

- Ras Shastra-Bhaishjya Kalpana (Pharmaceutical Science)
- Rog Nidan avam Vikriti Vigyan (Pathology & Microbiology)

4. Agad Tantra Evam Vidhi Vaidyaka (Clinical Toxicology)
5. Samhita Adhyayan-2 (Study of Ayurveda Classical Text)
6. Swastha Vritta & Yoga (Preventive and social medicine & yoga)

THIRD (FINAL) PROFESSIONAL EXAMINATION

The Third professional examination shall be held in the following subjects:-

8. Atyaikachikitsa (Emergency Medicine)
9. Research methodology & Medical-statistics.
10. Electives Subjects (Minimum Three)

COMPULSORY INTERNSHIP

Duration of Internship: 1 year. The student will join the rotatory compulsory internship after professional examination. The internship programme will start after the declaration of the result of final professional examination. The period of the internship will be of one year.

Internship programme and time distribution will be as follows :-

1. The interns will receive an orientation regarding programme details of internship programme during the first three days of the beginning of internship programme. A workbook will be given to each intern. The intern will enter date wise details of activities undertaken by him/her during his/her training.
2. Every intern will provisionally register himself with the concerned state board/council and obtain a certificate to this effect before joining the internship programme
3. Daily working hours of intern will not be less than eight hours.
4. Normally one year internship programme will be divided into clinical training of six months in the Ayurvedic hospital attached to the college and six months in PHC / CHC / Rural Hospital / District Hospital/Civil Hospital or any Govt. Hospital of modern medicine. But where there is no provision/permission of the State Government for allowing the graduate of Ayurveda in the hospital/dispensary of modern medicine, the one year internship will be completed in the hospital of Ayurvedic college.

Clinical training of six/twelve months as case may be in the Ayurvedic hospital attached to the college will be conducted as follows:-

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

The college students are required to follow the code of conduct as mentioned below :-

1. The Students should have a sense of elation for being student of a superb institute and regard for seniors & college staff.
2. Students shall avoid using insulting, inciting, threatening language when talking with fellow students and should avoid violence.
3. Students are expected to use only courteous and polite language and behave with decorum when talking to the faculty and staff members of college and hospital.
4. Students shall not talk or act in any manner outside the institution that would bring disrepute to the institution.
5. Ragging anywhere in the campus or outside the campus is strictly prohibited by Court of Law. Students found involved would be rusticated from the institute and handed over to the Court of Law.
6. Students should help in keeping the campus neat and tidy, Spitting, throwing pieces of paper, writing on walls etc. are not allowed inside the college campus.
7. Vehicles should be parked in assigned parking slots only.
8. No notice of any kind shall be circulated among students or displayed on notice boards or black boards without the written permission and approval of The Director / Principal.
9. Students are expected to read notices/circulars displayed on notice board or on internet regularly. Ignorance of not reading any notice or circular displayed shall not be accepted as an excuse failing to comply with the directions contained in it.
10. You are supposed to deposit required fees by demand draft or online well in time failing which extra fine would be charged and entry into campus would be restricted.
11. Help to maintain the beauty, serenity and greenery of the campus. Your suggestions for campus beautification and development shall always be welcomed.
12. The Management/Principal's decision shall be final in all matters of punishment of the students for violation of any of the rules and regulations of the college.
13. Students should come to their classes punctually and regularly. In case their attendance is less than 75% they may be debarred from appearing in the University Exams as per ordinances.
14. You are not supposed to remain absent from classes without prior permission of the Principal/or the Proctor/Vice-Principal. In case of absence Disciplinary action would be taken against such students under intimation to their parents/guardians.
15. Use of cell phones/mobiles is strictly prohibited in the classrooms.
16. In case the class is vacant, students would not loiter in the corridor and cause noise pollution. They should use their vacant hrs. in the library or at hobby centers.
17. Books are your best friends in leisure hours. Make use of the library as much as possible for this purpose.
18. Strict silence is to be observed in the library. Gossiping is prohibited there.
19. Keep your personal books and bags outside the library.
20. Books are issued only on ID card and should be returned within prescribed time.
21. No damage should be done to the books and literature kept in the library the cost of damage so caused will be recovered from the student.
22. You should have your identity card while sitting in the library. Please keep periodicals/books etc. at proper place after making use of them.
23. There will be a mandatory dress code throughout the course.

RULES FOR PAYMENT OF FEES & DUES

Note:- The fee structure is annual & provisional & subject to change in the light of the judgement of the honorable Supreme Court of India in TMA PAI foundation VS. State of Karnataka (2002) 8-SCC-481 & Islamic Academy of Education VS. State of Karnataka [(2003)6-SCC-697]

1. The fee structure is annual and is charged as per GRAU Hoshiarpur and the college dues applicable from time to time.
2. Students admitted in BAMS 1st Prof. will be required to make full payments on next working day, payment in installment will not be accepted
3. Fees for next year will have to be deposited on the commencement of the financial year i.e. in the month of April every year.
4. Name of the student not paying the dues till 15 days after the scheduled date will be struck off from the college rolls. Such students may be re-admitted on payment of readmission fee & fine (if allowed by the Principal).
5. The fees mentioned is subject to change in accordance with the decision of the court/Govt. of Punjab/G.R.A.U., Hoshiarpur.
6. Except security, dues once paid will not be refunded.
7. In case a student leaves the college during session, he/she will have to deposit the dues for the whole session.
8. A student who is absent or on leave must arrange to pay his dues on the scheduled date, otherwise he has to pay the fine.
9. A student not paying the dues will not be allowed to appear in the house examination not in annual examinations.
10. A student failing in any subject in the University examination shall be required to pay the tuition fee at the rate of Rs.2500/- per subject.
11. A student failing in all the subjects in the University examination shall be required to pay a lump sum amount of Rs.10,000/-.

INSTITUTE RULES/GENERAL RULES

1. The general control of the Institute is vested with the Principal.
2. Ragging of the first year students is forbidden and is punishable by imposing heavy fine, rustication or expulsion from Institute as per instructions received from UGC. UGC has notified 3rd Amendment in UGC Regulation on 29th June, 2016 to expand the definition of ragging by including the following:
Any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background.
3. All students shall comply with the (Institute) rules and regulations of the institute.
4. Hostel residents shall not be allowed to take meals from outside
5. All students must abide by the rules and regulations of the hostel given hereinafter. On failure to do so, disciplinary action will be taken by the hostel/college authorities.
6. Minimum 75 % of attendance in theory as well as in practicals separately is compulsory for appearing in University examination otherwise the students will be detained. No condonment of attendance will be permissible. No extra classes shall be held.
7. Regularity and punctuality in attendance at lectures, demonstrations, laboratory work, clinics and class examinations is compulsory.
8. Absence from regular class tests, and Mid-Term Examination is not allowed on any grounds.
9. Students who do not attain required attendance at lectures/clinics or who do not obtain at least 50% marks in each subject with exams or whose progress and/or conduct are not considered satisfactory, will not be allowed to appear in the University examination.
10. Leave or absence from classes or leave to go out of station at any time must be taken from the Principal/

through Heads of departments and respective Wardens on the prescribed “Student’s Leave Form”. Students returning late from leave will be treated absent from the classes, and due fine will be imposed. In case of illness, a medical certificate must be submitted along with the leave form and the period of time to be made up will be decided by the Principal. If a student is found to be remaining absent from classes without permission from the Principal of the Institute, it will be presumed that he is not willing to continue his studies in the Institute, and will be treated to have left the Institute of his own accord without completing his studies. In that case, the Institute will be in its right to recover from him the fee for the remaining period of the entire course.

11. Use of Mobile Phone is not allowed during Theory/Practicals/Clinical Classes in the Hospital and College.
12. Students are not allowed to paste /display notices or posters within the Institution without prior permission from the Principal, and are forbidden to address any outside authority directly. All such communications must be submitted through the Principal, who will forward them only if considered fit and necessary. A student infringing this rule will be suspended, and disciplinary action will be taken against him.
13. The Institute does not hold itself responsible for debts incurred by the students.
14. Students are not permitted to receive presents or money from the patients nor may they give presents to members of the staff individually.
15. Students must not crowd the Principal’s office area or use office telephone.
16. Students must pay for all damages caused by them of books and other college property. Breakages of apparatus must be paid by the student.
17. The following are strictly forbidden within any part of the Institute, or in the attached hospital:
 - (a) The possession or use of cigarette or tobacco in any form.
 - (b) The possession or use of alcoholic beverages.
 - (c) The possession or use of addictive or hallucinogenic drugs.
 - (d) Possession of fire-arms or any other lethal weapon.
 - (e) Gambling
18. Smoking is strictly forbidden.
19. Any illness, including even minor ailments, must be reported to the respective Warden or Principal as soon as possible.
20. Students must keep washable white coats, which are to be worn at all times in the Institute during classes, practicals and on hospital duty.
21. The students must keep their own instruments.
22. Girl students must keep their hair up, properly braided when at work in the Institute and hospital.
23. Institute fees must be paid in full by the dates stated in the prospectus, or the bills as otherwise notified by the office. A student whose fees, together with the fine imposed, remain unpaid for a calendar month after the due date, will be suspended from attending lectures or clinics or other classes until the fees have been fully paid.
24. The students must be in proper dress in the Institute as well as on hospital duty. Obscene dress is not allowed and action will be taken against defaulters. For girls: wearing of Salwar- kameez is allowed. No jeans and top is allowed. For boys: No T-shirts are allowed, only shirts are allowed.
25. Any student whose mess bills are not paid for two months, will not be allowed to attend classes until the unpaid bills with fine are cleared.
26. Irregularities, neglect of duties, breach of rules and indiscipline are to be dealt with strictly and necessary action will be taken by the Principal, Hostel authorities and Head of Department, as the case may be.
27. All students will display an identity badge on their white coats during working hours.
28. Students who do not maintain a satisfactory academic standard will not be allowed to hold any office in the institute committees etc. or to take part in extra curricular activities.
29. The Principal will deal with any serious offence for which, the penalty may be a written or verbal apology/ a fine/ suspension/ rustication or expulsion from the Institute.
30. Bus service is available and students have to pay on yearly basis. Monthly payments facilities is not available.

LIBRARY

General Information:

1. The library contains more than 10000 of books with latest editions and Recent Advances in all subjects of Ayurvedic Medical Sciences.
2. The students will strictly observe the rules of the Library, which are given below:-
 - a. There shall be a Library Committee, which will function under the general control of Principal.
 - b. The library shall remain open from 9.00 A.M. to 3.00 P.M. every day.
 - c. Silence and order must be maintained in the Library at all times. Any infringement of this rule will invite serious action. Mobile phones are strictly not allowed in the library.
 - d. Any person who causes loss, defaces or otherwise damages a book shall be liable to pay the cost at the current price, and in the event of the books being one of a set or series, the cost of the whole set or series will be recovered if the lost/damaged single copy is not available in the market for replacement of the lost/damaged book.
 - e. Books that are required for occasional references, such as Encyclopaedias, Dictionaries, Atlases, Year Books shall not be issued from the library.
 - f. Books issued/availed from the library are not transferable.
 - g. Books will be issued strictly on the priority of demand.
 - h. A limited number of books can be taken from the library at a time on the basis of library card.
 - i. No book shall be kept by any student for more than 14 days. For each day a book is kept over-time he/she shall have to pay a fine of Rs.100/- per book till it is returned to the library.
 - j. Every borrower shall be issued a library card. If this is lost, a duplicate card shall be issued by the office on payment of Rs.200/-
 - k. During the annual stock checking in the month of June, or at any other time, all books issued must be returned. A student who does not return the books shall have to pay double the charges i.e., Rs.200/- per day.
 - l. Newspapers and Magazines are kept on day to day basis for the use of students and it must not be taken away under any circumstances, nor any page or a part of it be torn away.

INSTITUTE HOSTELS

(Hostel accommodation are made available)

Hostel Rules: Common for both Boys and Girls

Note: Students are advised to read the following rules carefully. A resident who violates any of these rules will make himself/herself liable to disciplinary action; and if he/she violates any of the rules and regulations more than twice, he/she shall be expelled from the hostel, in addition to any fine that may be imposed on him/her.

1. No student shall keep any unauthorised person in his/her room. If any such person is found in his/her room, he/she will be liable to be summarily expelled. For stay of one of the parents in case of need/emergency, he/she will have to take prior permission from the Principal/Warden.
2. The student will show hostel fee receipt to the Hostel Superintendent/Warden before admission to the Hostel at the time of admission to the college.
3. Each student must occupy the room allotted to him/her for the session by the Warden and no change of room shall be made without permission of Principal.
4. Each resident student is responsible for the cleanliness and proper up-keep of the room allotted. He/she will be held responsible for any damage done to furniture and fixtures in the room. If any student leaves the hostel and fails to hand over in good order all the room furniture together with electric bulbs etc. will be liable to be

- fined, apart from being required to pay for any damage done.
5. Residents are responsible for the loss or damages to electrical fittings in their rooms.
 6. When any room is found locked or left vacant for long, the concerned student shall be liable to pay penalty of Rs. 1000/- per day.
 7. The Hostel Superintendent/Warden shall have the power to fine a student to the extent of rent for the whole month.
 8. Air Conditioners, Coolers, Refrigerators, Electric Stoves, Room heaters or any other electrical appliance of heavy consumption are not allowed without permission and prior payment. Television, Tape-recorder, Audio or Video CD player, Video Cassette Recorder/Player, are also not allowed to be used.
 9. Student found making a wrong use of electricity will be fined upto Rs. 2000/- in addition to the cost of repairs, if any; and the matter will be reported to the Principal for such disciplinary action as he deem fit.
 10. Each Hostel shall be under the control of the Hostel Supdt./Warden.
 11. Mess workers and Sewadars are under the control of the Hostel Supdt/Warden who only may take action against them for negligence, indiscipline, etc.
 12. Residents are strictly forbidden to utilise hostel Sewadar/Sewadarni for personal work, or interfere with their work or use any abusive language about them in any way. No excuse whatsoever will be accepted for a breach of this rule. All complaints against hostel Sewadars should be brought to the notice of the Hostel Superintendent/Warden who will investigate the matter and take necessary decision
 13. The residents will not argue, abuse or misbehave with the mess-contractor or vice-versa. Complaints, if any, should be brought to the notice of the Hostel Supdt/Warden immediately.
 14. The inside gate directly connecting the Hostel shall remain locked between 08.00 p.m. and 6.00 a.m.
 15. A student who is resident for a part of any month shall be charged rent for the whole month.
 16. A student expelled from the Hostel shall not be admitted in the hostel again.
 17. Any student found in possession of, or having used, alcoholic drinks or addicting or hallucinogenic drugs will be expelled from the hostel immediately.
 18. Students are required to pay their mess bills by 10th of every month positively, failing which they will be suspended from the classes.
 19. Before going out from hostel, residents are required to take prior permission and make entry in the Register by writing their names as well as date and time of leaving the hostel and of return as well.
 20. Female students will not be allowed in the Boys Hostel and vice versa.
 21. In the event of mischief/foul play or accident etc., the Warden/Hostel Supdt. can break open the lock/door of the room for investigations.
 22. Interns will have to pay the hostel fee & generator charges before admission to the hostel provided accommodation is available.
 23. Fees once paid shall not be refunded under any circumstances.

HOSTEL RULES - FOR GIRLS

1. The parents will write in the prescribed pro-forma at the time of the hostel admission, the names of relations who could visit the Girls Hostel. The relationship of such persons should be specifically mentioned. The Hostel Supdt/Warden will have the sole right to grant or refuse permission to any visitor. Student/parents must provide full address, telephone number of the relatives whom the hosteller can visit with the permission of the Hostel superintendent.

2. No resident of the hostel will be absent from the hostel without the written permission of the Warden/ Hostel Supdt./Principal. Residents wishing to visit their 'friends, relatives allowed by the parents, even on holidays, shall obtain the written permission of the Hostel Supdt./Warden. If this rule is not observed by the hosteller, the consequences and responsibility shall be entirely of the hosteller/parents.
3. Students wishing to absent themselves from the hostel after 7.00 p.m. in winter and 8.00 p.m. in summer shall obtain prior permission from the Warden and shall sign a register kept in the hostel office noting the date and time of departure and of arrival back, which should not exceed the time mentioned in the permit. Permit for leaving the hostel may be obtained from the Warden/ Supdt. between 6.00 p.m. to 7.00 p.m. or the time fixed by the Hostel Supdt./ Warden.
4. The student who wants to go home for any reason should first obtain permission from the Principal/ Hostel Supdt., and on the basis of that she will seek the Warden's permission to leave the hostel, failing which the entire responsibility will be of the student concerned and of the parents.
5. The gate/s of the hostel shall be locked at 8.00p.m. and shall be opened at 6.00a.m. (summer), 7.00 a.m. (winter) and no student shall be allowed to leave the hostel during these timing without the prior permission as given above. However, the student can leave hostel after 6.00a.m. (summer), 7.00 a.m. (winter) for morning walk or visiting Gurdwara/temple etc. if they desire so.
6. Permission to visit parent's home/local guardian/relations will be granted once in a month on a Sunday/ holiday only. Hostel pass will be issued by Warden. Any student found absent from the hostel without permission shall be liable to fine and other disciplinary action.
7. Student should sign daily in the attendance register kept in the warden's office in the evening between 7-00 p.m. to 8.00 p.m. in the winter & 8.00 p.m. to 9.00 p.m. in the summer.
8. Any illness must be reported to the Hostel Supdt./Warden by the student or friends concerned at once.
9. Male visitors shall not be allowed in Girls hostel and vice versa.
10. No male student will be permitted in the Girls Hostel with any excuse including Holi, Diwali or Birthday Celebrations etc.

All the parents/guardians of the students are advised to go through the hostel rules carefully before applying for a seat to be allotted in the hostel. The above mentioned hostel rules are to be followed very strictly by the students.

UNIVERSITY RULES REGARDING RAGGING AND ITS PREVENTION

The word 'ragging' means the act of teasing, taunting, playing a practical joke upon someone or holding comic parades and other activities during certain period of a college terms.

But over the years, the word ragging ceased to denote the healthy practice it used to be and has acquired more negative connotations and notoriety. Now a days 'ragging' may include:-

Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, teasing, excitement by rough or rude treatment or handling, indulging in rowdy, undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, undue hardship, physical or psychological harm or raise apprehension or fear in a fresher or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such a student will not do in the ordinary course and which causes him/her shame or embarrassment or danger to his/her life.

To prevent ragging, some State Governments enacted legislation defining ragging, suggesting preventive measures and punishment. The University Grants Commission strongly recommends that every educational institution should take steps to curb the menace of ragging.

Every Institution should implement the following measures to prevent ragging:-

- 1) At the commencement of academic session, the head of the institution may address a meeting of various agencies like wardens, representatives of students, parents/guardians, faculty, police and other law and order machinery with an appeal to help to eradicate the menace of ragging in the Institution completely.
- 2) At the commencement of academic session, the Institution should constitute a vigilance committee consisting of senior faculty members, some hostel authorities like wardens and few responsible senior students to have an inbuilt mechanism for checking the incidence of ragging. The committee should monitor the events involving ragging, enquire into them and make recommendations in this regard to the Institution authorities. The committee can draw its modalities of functioning, frequency of visits/meetings etc.
- 3) The powers of wardens and other authorities should be suitably enhanced. Some of them may be vested with a kind of powers so that they can take immediate action in certain situations.
- 4) A disciplinary committee may be set up at the Institution level to consider the recommendations of the vigilance committee and spell out the punishments. If considered necessary, this committee can further investigate the events and recommendation which were brought before it.
- 5) The head of the Institution should take immediate action on receipt of the recommendations of the disciplinary committee. He can also take action if the circumstances so demand.
- 6) Fresher should be encouraged to report incidents of ragging. Those who do not do so even when being witnesses or victims should also be punished suitably.
- 7) When the persons committing or abetting the crime of ragging are not identified, collective punishment could be resorted to as a possible deterrent measure, as it would ensure community pressure on the potential raggers not to indulge in ragging.
- 8) An anti ragging committee is here by framed. As per orders of honorable Supreme Court of India ragging of any type is absolutely banned. Anti ragging and womencell members with their contact number.

PUNISHMENTS

The following could be the possible punishments for those who are found guilty of participation in or abetment of ragging. The quantum of punishment shall naturally depend upon the nature and gravity of the offence as established by the disciplinary committee or the Court of law.

- 1) Suspension from attending classes.
- 2) Withholding/withdrawing scholarship and other benefits.
- 3) Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- 4) Withholding results.
- 5) Debarring from representing the Institution in any national and international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
- 6) Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
- 7) Rustication from the Institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters.
- 8) Expulsion from the Institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
- 9) Fine up to Rs. 25,000/- may be charged.
